John Lipsky

Mr. Lipsky is a Senior Fellow of the Foreign Policy Institute of Johns Hopkins University's School of Advanced International Studies (SAIS). Previously, he was first deputy managing director of the International Monetary Fund (IMF) during 2006-2011, and served as acting managing director during May-July, 2011. Before returning to the IMF in 2006, he served as a Vice Chairman of the JPMorgan Investment Bank, Chief Economist and Director of Research at Chase Manhattan Bank, and Chief Economist of Salomon Brothers. Prior to his private sector career, he spent a decade at the IMF.

Mr. Lipsky currently is a co-chair of the Aspen Institute's Program on the World Economy, and a vice-chair of the Bretton Woods Committee. He is a member of the executive committee of the National Bureau of Economic Research, of the advisory boards of the Stanford Institute for Economic Policy Research (SIEPR) and of the Rock Creek Group, is a director of the American Council on Germany, and is a life member of the Council on Foreign Relations. Mr. Lipsky received a Ph.D. in Economics from Stanford University.
