Brit McCandless Farmer is an award-winning journalist with a career spanning print, broadcast, and digital news. As the digital producer for *60 Minutes* at CBS News, Farmer extends the broadcast's reporting online, giving the 60 Minutes audience a deeper dive into the subjects on television, and helps introduce the storied news magazine to a new generation of viewers. Her work has been recognized by the Webby, Gracie, Wilbur, and Telly awards. Previously, Farmer worked at the CBS Weekend Evening News and CBS This Morning, where she produced interviews with presidential candidates, elected officials, and business leaders. Before joining CBS, she worked at CNN, where she was a member of a producing and reporting team that won a Peabody Award. She is the immediate past-president of the Carnegie Mellon Alumni Association Board, a former trustee of Carnegie Mellon University, and a term member of the Council on Foreign Relations. Farmer lives in New York City with her husband and two young sons.
