Cameron Hume was a Foreign Service Officer for 40 years, including tours as US ambassador to Algeria, South Africa, Indonesia and US chief of mission in Sudan.

In the past ten years he was chair of NOAA's Ocean Exploration Advisory Committee. He worked with the late Gov. Bill Richardson to negotiate the release of prisoners from Russia, Iran, Mexico, Myanmar and Venezuela. He now is chairman of the board of Maritime Humanitarian Aid Foundation (MHAF), a non-profit foundation that provided millions of meals to civilians in Gaza and Sudan.

He served as a Peace Corps Volunteer in Libya. He is admitted to the bar in New York and in Washington, DC.
