Daniel E. White is the deputy chief of staff to the secretary of the army. White first joined the Biden-Harris Administration as the special assistant to the assistant secretary of defense for strategy, plans, and capabilities. Later, he was the chief of staff to the assistant secretary of the army for manpower and reserves affairs. He began his career as a field artillery officer in the U.S. Army serving in Asia, the Middle East and stateside, culminating on the immediate staff of 52nd Field Artillery Commandant. After leaving the Army as a captain, he completed stints on the security and defense team at the transatlantic think tank the German Marshall Fund to the United States, the corporate strategy team at Lockheed Martin, and the J5 strategy, policy, and plans directorate at U.S. Southern Command. White started in the Pentagon in the programming and resources division and then helped stand up the space division for the deputy undersecretary of the air force for international affairs. He is a graduate of the U.S. Military Academy and holds a MPA from the Columbia University's School of International and Public Affairs.
