Jonathan Tepperman

Jonathan Tepperman is a writer, journalist, editor, and foreign-policy analyst with twenty-five years' experience in the field. After studying English at Yale and International Law at Oxford and NYU, Tepperman worked briefly as a speechwriter before joining *Foreign Affairs* as a junior editor. He then moved to *Newsweek*, where he was Deputy Editor of the international edition, before returning to *Foreign Affairs* as Managing Editor. He then became Editor-in-Chief of *Foreign Policy* in 2017.

Tepperman has had a prolific career as a writer and a commentator; his op-eds, essays, and reviews have been published frequently in *The New York Times*, *The Washington Post*, *The Wall St. Journal*, *The Atlantic*, *The New Republic*, *Foreign Affairs*, *Foreign Policy*, *Newsweek*, and many other publications. He has interviewed close to two dozen heads of state, including Bashar al-Assad in 2015. He was the first Western journalist to interview Shinzo Abe after his return to power in 2013 and the first to interview Joko Widodo after his election in 2014.

Tepperman's critically-acclaimed 2016 book, *THE FIX: How Countries Use Crises to Solve the World's Worst Problems* drew on original reportage from more than ten countries and interviews with leaders and heads of state from Indonesia to Rwanda to Brazil. *THE FIX* was longlisted by the *Financial Times* as its best business book of the year. Called "an indispensable handbook" by *The New York Times*, it has been translated into seven languages. Tepperman's TED talk based on the book, *The Risky Politics of Progress*, has been viewed more than a million times.
