Robert Carey is a leadership in government fellow at the Open Society Foundations. He served as the director of the Office of Refugee Resettlement (ORR) in the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services during the Obama administration. ORR was charged with the administration of the U.S. national resettlement program, which provides a range of social, medical, and other services to refugees, asylees, victims of torture, and unaccompanied children through state governments and nonprofit organizations across the country.

Previously, Carey served as vice president for resettlement and migration policy at the International Rescue Committee (IRC), leading IRC's efforts to advance systematic change in domestic and international refugee resettlement, refugee protection, immigration policy, and human trafficking. Carey is the former chair of the Refugee Council USA, a coalition of nonprofits focused on refugee protection.

Carey earned a BA in history from Trinity College in Hartford, Connecticut, and attended the Barbieri Center in Rome, Italy. He frequently speaks to media regarding refugee and asylum issues.
