



Scott Smith

Scott S. Smith is the Chief of the Political Affairs Service at the United Nations Assistance Mission (UNAMA) in Afghanistan since May 2021. Mr. Smith has worked on Afghanistan for almost 25 years, mostly with the United Nations Department of Political Affairs and Department of Peacekeeping Operations, both at Headquarters and for the United Nations Assistance Mission in Afghanistan. In addition to working for the United Nations, Mr. Smith was the Director for Afghanistan and Central Asia Programs at the United States Institute of Peace between 2012-2016. He has also worked for the United Nations in Papua New Guinea, Cote d'Ivoire, and Lebanon. Mr. Smith has a Masters' Degree from Columbia University's School for International and Public Affairs (1998) and a Bachelors in Science from Georgetown University's School of Foreign Service (1991). He is the author of *Afghanistan's Troubled Transition: Peacekeeping, Politics and the 2004 Presidential Election* (Lynne Reiner, 2011), co-editor of *Getting it Right in Afghanistan* (USIP, 2013), and numerous papers and articles on Afghanistan. He has taught as an adjunct professor at both Columbia University and at Boston University.
