José Díaz Briseño is currently the Washington correspondent for *Reforma*. He is also spearheading the creation of a new English-language news product by *Reforma* called MexicoToday.com. His reporting with *Reforma* covers mostly U.S.-Mexico affairs: trade policy, immigration, counternarcotics, tourism, and border security. From 2013 to 2015, Díaz Briseño was the White House correspondent for MundoFOX, a U.S. Spanish TV network. Before arriving in Washington, Díaz Briseño was based in Tucson, Arizona where he worked as the U.S.-Mexico border affairs correspondent for *El Imparcial*, a regional daily in northwestern Mexico. Díaz Briseño started his journalism career as a news researcher for the *Los Angeles Times* Mexico City bureau. He has a master's from Columbia University's Graduate School of Journalism and was a recipient of a Fulbright Scholarship. He studied international relations at El Colegio de México and has done summer courses on U.S. politics and history at the University of California-San Diego.
