

## **Brent Wilton**

Brent Wilton is principal with Tuhana Business and Human Rights Ltd. From 2015 to 2020, he was global director of human and workplace rights with the Coca-Cola Company. From 1999 to 2015, he was based in Switzerland with the International Organization of Employers representing businesses on global labor and social policy matters in the International Labor Organization and across the UN and multilateral system. He also worked with trade unions, NGOs, and governments, negotiating and resolving issues related to human rights and worker exploitation.

Additionally, he served on the board of the UN Global Compact where he was involved in the discussions for the creation of the UN Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights, and was co-chair of the UN multi-stakeholder labor and human rights working group.

A New Zealand trained labor lawyer, Wilton has spent the last thirty-two years representing companies and their representative organizations across a range of labor and human rights issues in countries around the world. He is a member of the World Economic Forum's Global Future Council on Human Rights, the Leadership Group for Responsible Recruitment, co-chair of the Consumer Goods forum coalition working to end forced labor, on the advisory council for the Geneva-based Center for Sports and Human Rights, and formerly a member of the FIFA Human Rights Advisory Board (2017–2020).
